This is a "Post Graduate Prepare U": a special topic being presented after the recent "Prepare U" sessions that occurred August and September of 2022.

“Targeted Violence” is any incident of violence where an individual or group selects a specific target, prior to an attack, regardless of motive.

Violence is preventable.

Prevention is better than reaction.

Prevention is less expensive, less stressful, more compassionate, and more effective.

The “Bay Area Targeted Violence and Terrorism Prevention Program”, one of the many Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (BAUASI) programs, developed this curriculum, which takes a Public Health approach to violence prevention: evidence-based, multi-disciplinary, diverse, and focused on taking collective action using input from a wide range of stakeholders, including health, education, social services, justice, policy and the private sector.

The goal of this training is to help those in need, preventing violence, and taking them off of the path to extremism.

This training covers the current threat landscape, teaches the basics of behavioral analysis, how to look for pre-attack indicators, the details of the radicalization process that leads to targeted violence, the increasing role of social media in extremism, prevention tactics and strategies, reporting, and local programs.

This is a very pertinent topic for community and faith based organizations, educational institutions, workplace settings, and any general community locations.

Learn how to empower communities to help those in need, before a problem occurs, while still supporting privacy, civil rights and liberties.

There are always warning signs; learn how to identify and prevent problems before they happen.
