

Clergy Tax Withholding Request Form

**Complete this form to set specific Fed & State withholding amounts
To be used in lieu of W4 or State EDD forms**

By law, clergy are exempt from the federal and state withholding requirements to which lay employees are subject. Estimated tax payments to taxing authorities are made quarterly by the individual. You may, however, choose to have federal or state taxes withheld from your paycheck to avoid having to file quarterly estimated taxes. The amount withheld should approximate your annual tax liability, including self-employment tax, and be divided by 24 to equal the amount to be withheld per paycheck. Withholding is based on the flat rate indicated. Forms W-4 are not accepted.
